Employer Follow-up of the 2014-2015 Class

Office of Institutional Research, Evaluation, and Assessment

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There were 502 students who completed the requirements for his or her degree or certificate program(s) between July 1, 2014 and June 30, 2015. Three attempts were made to contact these individuals to respond to the Graduate Follow-Up Survey regarding their employment, educational status, and the evaluation of various MCCC services and programs. To incentivize participation, five respondents were randomly selected to receive a \$10 gift card for their time. Graduates were invited to participate through a mail survey and a Web-based format. The response rate was 19.4%. Overall the demographic characteristics of respondents were quite representative of the graduating class, although 20 to 25-year-olds were slightly underrepresented, as were the small number of certificate earners.

Employers of graduates were also surveyed when supplied by the graduate as part of their survey. Thirty-eight surveys were mailed to employers, with a response rate of 31%. Employers provided their perception of the job preparation and performance of their MCCC graduate. Both the employer feedback and graduate feedback on College services were largely positive.
