Position	Political Science Instructor, Humanities/Social Sciences Division
Description	Teaching of a variety of Political Science courses including Introduction to Political Science, Introduction to Comparative Politics, State and Local Government, and International Relations. Other responsibilities and duties will include the participation in Division-wide program and curriculum planning and assessment of student learning outcomes. The successful candidate will be expected to prepare instructional strategies and materials to meet the needs of the students, including the revision, planning, and development of courses and course delivery methods. As an integral member of the Division, the individual is expected to develop effective collegial relationships, work closely with students and local employers, and promote division programs and the College in general.
Qualifications	Minimum of a Master's degree in Political Science or Master's degree with 18 graduate hours in Political Science; Ph. D. in Political Science preferred. Evidenced teaching skill and ability to identify and implement assessment of student learning strategies and practices. Collegiate level teaching experience desired. Experience with the use of technology-mediated, online, and distance-learning techniques desired.
Salary	Per 2017-18 Master Agreement, pay range \$50,571-\$62,125. Salary may be negotiated depending upon experience and education. Faculty contract teaching load 14-16 hours per week not including office/advising hours or other college commitments, 162-day school year. Additional compensation for extra contractual assignments; Spring and/or Summer teaching opportunities may be available.
