# **MCCC ANNOUNCES ACCREDITATION REVIEW VISIT FOR ASSOCIATE DEGREE IN NURSING PROGRAM**

## *Comments Sought from Interested Parties*

MONROE, Mich. – Monroe County Community College will host a site review visit for the continuing accreditation of its associate degree in nursing program and is seeking comments from interested parties.

The college has been engaged in accreditation activities, with the goal of securing continued accreditation through 2019, the maximum accreditation period awarded by the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission. The process continues as a team from NLNAC will be on campus April 18-20 to review both the generic and online options for completing the associate degree in nursing program. The program is currently accredited through June 2011. The resulting team recommendations will be forwarded to Evaluation Review Panel. The ERP will make a recommendation to the NLNAC for final action, which is expected prior to June 30.

Interested parties are invited to meet the visit team and share comments about the program in person at a meeting scheduled for April 19 at 4 p.m. in the La-Z-Boy Center, Rooms 257-258.
