MONROE, Mich. – Monroe County Community College’s Bacchus Society will present the second-annual “Community Crush” – grape crushing and de-stemming while you wait – on Sunday, Sept. 20.

The event, which is free and open to the public, will take place from 11 a.m.-2 p.m. in the MCCC Wine Lab, which is located in the West Technology Building on the college’s Main Campus, 1555 S. Raisinville Rd., Monroe.
