Complainant came to the Security office and advised Officer that on Tuesday 04/03/18 at approximately 4:30pm, he parked his vehicle next to the staff parking places outside of the east entry doors of the CTC building. When he returned to the vehicle about 8:30pm he noted that the gas tank door was standing open and the gas cap was hanging by its cord. Due to his gas gauge, he believes that someone had siphoned between 1 to 1.5 gallons of gas from his tank. Complainant was certain that he had closed his gas tank after his last stop for fuel.

He also advised that his brother had had his vehicle parked in the same lot, during the same time period and that someone had stolen items from inside the vehicle. He also advised that his brother had made a police report of that incident.

Officer requested complainant to have victim contact him about the incident and later spoke with victim on the phone. Victim advised that he had parked his truck near complainant's vehicle on 04/03/18 at about 5:30pm, without locking the vehicle and he had left the lot at about 8:50pm.

Victim found that his bank card was missing from the truck and filed police report with the Monroe City Police. When I advised victim that the City Police would not be handling a college larceny he advised that they did because he wasn't sure if the theft had occurred in the Meijer's parking lot, his apartment complex lot, or at the college.

Both complainant and victim requested that the security cameras be checked and their mother called the Security office to request the cameras be checked.

Officer advised all three that he would check the closest cameras and let them know if he found anything. There are no camera images of that area.

Security personnel will keep an eye on the area.
