IN PARTICULAR THERE WAS ONE DEAN THAT WAS NOT A PLEASANT PERSON. I DID NOT FEEL COMFORTABLE AROUND HIM BECAUSE HE WAS FAR TOO AGGRESSIVE.

My experience has been overall really well however, I think the beginning mathematics courses (090,092, and 151) should be available online rather than basically still taking an online class but also required to go into class twice a week, which is how all three classes are currently operated. I am also disappointed that the only two options for taking statistics (162) this fall was 9 AM and 7:30 PM OR, drive to temperance which is inconvenient for me as I live in town and much closer to campus. Lastly, is an odd but relevant complaint. The seating in the classes are terrible, quite uncomfortable while sitting through a lecture.

The only problem that I have encountered at the college is that they had conflicting information about what books I needed. An instructor was telling me I needed one book while the bookstore said that it was not required for the course. Eventually I had to purchase the book anyway, but it put me slightly behind and it was an additional 200 dollars that I had to spend. I am currently caught up in the class and all is well. I just wanted to put this out there so others did not have the same problem.

When I signed up at the end of senior year they told me I needed certain classes for my degree in ECE. I tested out of the math class I was placed in and showed that to whom I was told would fix it. Turns out no one did and what they signed me up for didn't go towards my early childhood education degree and they (without my consent) switched my degree program to Applied Science. Along with that they have some very rude teachers that don't like to hear when their wrong. Even if you can find proof. Other then all that I have enjoyed my time here.

I believe that the cost of tuition is unfair for online classes. Most of my classes are only available online and I have to pay an additional \$75 for each class strictly because they're online. Seeing as online classes are mostly self motivated and there is limited contact with the instructor I don't understand why I b should have to pay an additional fee.


I prefer online classes but thus far every online class I have taken has had stressful technical issues with the book, software, or website it uses. When the problems come up it is difficult to get help and once I had to seek the Dean of Students because my professor was never available to meet at her office scheduled times nor would she reply to my emails within 48 -72 hours.

In other schools such as WCC they offer more online classes for people like me who have to work full time. I unfortunately will have to switch to WCC and leave MCCC because of the availability of online courses.

I have been attending MCCC for almost five years now, and I am proud to have been able to participate in their academics. The campus feels like a second home to me. It's been refreshing to see all the new changes as the college updates the website, architecture, and course schedules. I'm very grateful to everything they've given me and all the earned opportunities.



### What academic program are you currently enrolled in?





## How do you primarily take classes at your school?





### What is your current age?





### What is your gender?




