

Our Friend – Dr. David Nixon



We are deeply saddened to announce the recent passing of President Emeritus Dr. David Nixon. He passed away on January 18, 2023 at the age of 83. It was during Dr. Nixon's tenure that the Upward Bound Program was established at Monroe County Community College to support at-risk students at Monroe High School in 2007 via an initial five-year, \$1 million federal grant from the United States Department of Education.

The program was later expanded to include Airport Senior High School and Jefferson High School. It was through his vision and effort that has enabled students the opportunity to change the trajectory of their lives, their families, and their community for the better through higher education.

This day is an opportunity to focus our attention on the needs of disadvantaged youths and adults and our community. National TRIO Day has become a tradition. It allows students who benefit from the TRIO – Upward Bound Programs of Airport High School, Jefferson High School and Monroe High School the chance to give back to their communities through community service.



Listed below are ten ideas for Community Service opportunities.

- 2. Helping at church activities
- Raising awareness about TRIO through visits or letters to the State Capitol
- 4. Reading to children at the local library
- 5. Cleaning your school grounds, a park, your neighborhood or other public area

- 8. Collecting socks, mittens, toiletries, etc. for a homeless shelter
- 9. Organizing a food drive for a local food closet

Upward Bound 2023 graduates will be eligible to compete for the Bridge Scholarship Program. Students who are selected will have the opportunity to enroll for the 2023 summer semester at Monroe County Community College. Students selected in this program will have the chance to complete up to six credit hours free of charge. This scholarship includes:

- A. Tuition at MCCC up to six credit hours of approved courses.
- B. Books and supplies not to exceed \$100.00
- C. Tutoring and monitoring by Upward Bound Staff

In order to be considered for a scholarship you must fulfill the following requirements:

- 1. A 75% attendance rate at tutorial sessions over the course of your junior and senior years.
- 2. A 75% attendance rate at optional activities (field trips, college visits, etc.) over the course of your junior and senior years.
- 3. Must graduate from high school with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better
- 4. Must have completed all senior year requirements by the required deadlines.
- 5. Must complete an MCCC application and Bridge Application provided by your Coordinator for admission.
- 6. Students must have completed Upward Bound's summer program in the past two years in good standing.

I have enjoyed the first half of my first full year supporting Upward Bound Students here at MHS as the UB Academic Coordinator. MHS UB students have already had opportunities to attend our kickoff pizza party, a tour of The University of Toledo, a University of Michigan football game, a field trip to the lights at The Toledo Zoo, and our annual holiday dinner. Eight of our students will be attending the annual Student Leadership Summit at the end of February as well. I look forward to adding additional field trip opportunities and incentives, as the second half of the school year progresses. Information regarding fieldtrips, awards, community service hours, and summer program will be communicated to MHS, Upward Bound Students via Google Classroom. If UB Students are not yet registered for our Google Classroom, they should register ASAP by using our classroom code, h3th4su.

We will be continuing to offer free tutoring on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 2:30-4:30 p.m. in room B-221, which includes free drinks, snacks, and LET transportation. UB students are also now eligible to receive up to \$30 a month in their stipend check, simply for attending tutoring. UB students, please remember, it is an expectation that you check in with me weekly by stopping in my office B-221, texting me on my Google voice 734-265-0105, or e-mailing me at rubley@monroe.k12.mi.us, if you cannot attend at least one tutoring session weekly. It is extremely important I have at least weekly contact with every student so I can stay informed regarding each student's progress and current needs.

This year, Upward Bound is returning to a requirement for all students to complete at least seven hours of community service. The requirement was suspended for a couple years due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which made finding community service opportunities difficult to impossible for most students (who frankly had their hands more than full just trying to survive remote learning). This year, with most COVID restrictions removed, and a return to something that looks like what used to be normal, the community service requirement is back

Why does Upward Bound require their students to do this? Well, in the big picture, giving back to your community promotes personal growth and self-esteem. When people come together to give their time and energy to a worthy cause, they feel better about themselves; they meet new people and learn about their community and its needs and services. Volunteering strengthens the community, supports families and youth, improves schools, and allows worthy causes to save money and resources that would otherwise come from often under-funded budgets.

On a more practical level, students who perform community service gain new knowledge, skills, and valuable work experience. These can be added to job applications and resumes—and for high school students who have not yet entered the work force, may help them stand out and land a job they may not have otherwise been able to get.

Community service work is also an important part of a student's portfolio when applying to colleges and universities—especially schools with lower acceptance rates. Colleges and universities that are selective are flooded with applications from students with great GPAs and SAT scores, and often have to look at intangibles in order to select the best candidates. Strong extracurricular involvement, including community service, can make the difference between getting accepted, or not getting accepted, to your college of choice.

The key to quality community service is to pick something you enjoy or are passionate about. This will help motivate you to do the work and will demonstrate that you are capable of committing to something over a period of time. So, if you haven't already, get started today. Find your passion and get out there and work!

- Display Excellent Behavior both in and out of the classroom and follow their home school's Code of Conduct/Disciplinary Code.
- Have a Positive Attitude, Be Kind, and Demonstrate Respect and Responsibility
