





#### Basic RiderCourse 2 (BRC2) | Experienced Riders

Designed for the experienced rider to refresh skill on their personal motorcycle and obtain a license endorsement. This course is NOT for beginning riders. Students must demonstrate competency with basic operational skills and pass the Level 1 written test during the screening exercises in order to continue in the course. 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
